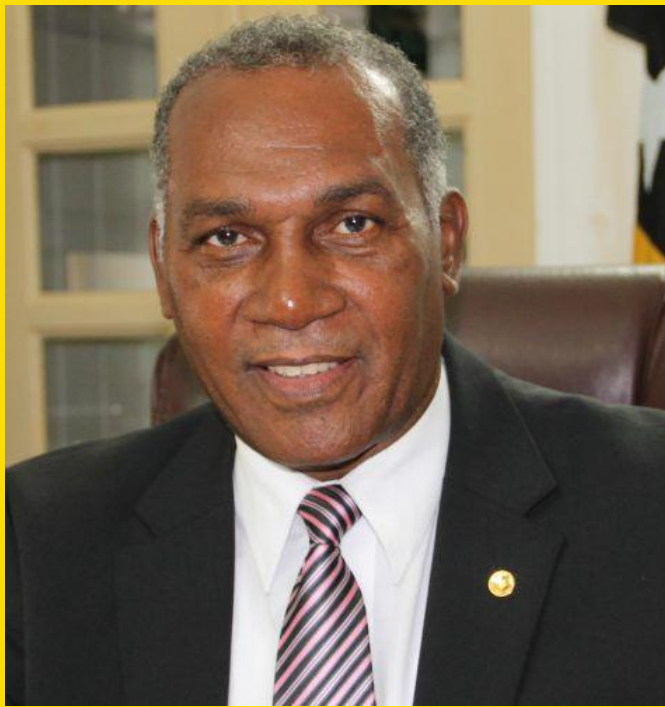

On August 5th 2022, you have the opportunity to elect a government that will always put you first.

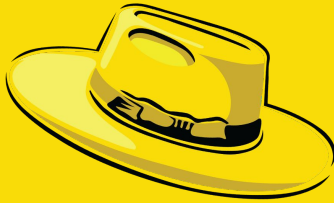

OUR RECORD OF SUCCESS

In 2015, The People's Action Movement and the Concerned Citizens Movement held six of the eleven seats in the parliament of St. Kitts & Nevis. In 2020, we increased the number of seats to seven. Thus, PAM-CCM led the way in designing every single policy and program that brought prosperity to the people of St. Kitts and Nevis.

Our achievements over the last seven years are unquestionable, as we continually put people first. As you elect us to form the new government on August 05th 2022, reflect on some of our major accomplishments to date, and use them as an indication of what we will achieve in the future.

One Movement, involving the People's Action Movement and the Concerned Citizens Movement is committed to delivering on the promises made in 2020; expand our policies; and implement programs that will capitalise on emerging market opportunities.

During the last seven years, PAM-CCM jointly delivered increased housing, advanced education, expanded tourism, improved infrastructure, and established diplomatic relations with several foreign partners. Programs such as the Roofing initiative, Poverty Alleviation Program (PAP), Skills Training Empowerment Program (STEP), and the Alternative Lifestyle Pathway Program (ALPP), commonly referred to as the "PEACE Program", were designed to help alleviate the financial strains caused by global economic recessions and the COVID-19 pandemic. From a sports perspective, we were also able to attract major international events including the 2020 CPL, 2022 ICC Under-19 Cricket World Cup, and the inaugural edition of the Sixty cricket tournament to be hosted in August 2022. Such sporting events stimulated multiple revenue streams for our people.

PAM-CMM has however focused on multi-dimensional advancement. For example, the St. Kitts Nevis passport was elevated to the number 1 ranking across the Caribbean region. Further, the Citizenship By Investment Program was also ranked number 1 in 2021 among 14 international countries that offer this facility. Additionally, St. Kitts and Nevis was able to enjoy visa-free access to several nations, including our African counterparts. Such global relationships availed numerous scholarship opportunities resulting in further empowerment for our youth.

Under education, at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, St. Kitts and Nevis was still able to safely complete its curricula and return excellent CXC examination results. The tourism industry also made significant strides, with the nation receiving several global accolades. Further, increased cruise passengers and stay-over tourist led to record arrivals. Simply put, tourism placed money in the pockets of our people, while keeping the local economy buoyant.

Local creatives and entertainers also benefited from our cultural festivities. For instance, while countries across the Caribbean cancelled their carnivals due to COVID-19, some for two consecutive years. St. Kitts and Nevis was able to safely host Sugar Mas in 2020 and 2021. Similarly, the St. Kitts Music Festival has exploded arguably, as the leading festival regionally.

On both islands, tremendous progress has also been made infrastructurally, where roads have been improved; new police, fire, and customs complexes have either been refurbished or built; homes have been constructed; and new cruise ship terminals have been introduced.

Thus, we repeat, our record is unquestionable giving your more reason to vote for PAM-CCM.

OUR PRIORITIES

1 CREATING JOBS

We will enable hundreds of new micro, small, and medium enterprises, while simultaneously supporting the expansion of existing businesses across all sectors.

2 WAR ON POVERTY

We will expand existing Poverty Alleviation programs aimed at improving the lives and livelihoods of all people.

3 CARING FOR PEOPLE

We will prioritize healthcare and education. We will provide free healthcare, construct a state-of-the-art hospital with modern equipment and medical supplies, and professionalize our health services to meet international standards. We will also build human capacity to better prepare our youth for success in the global economy.

4 NATIONAL YOUTH AGENDA

Our youth programs will increase opportunities in leadership, entrepreneurship and business management, academic scholarships, mentorship programs, and vocational initiatives. In this way, the dreams of our young people can be realized.

5 BOOSTING TOURISM

We will diversify our tourism product and promote same beyond traditional source markets to strategically expand the industry. We will support niche markets in the areas of business, health, sports, land-based, eco, entertainment, community, and heritage tourism.

6 ENHANCING FOOD SECURITY

We will increase access to affordable financing, training and coaching, and prime agricultural lands through a land bank initiative. The objective is to reignite and technologically upgrade land-based and marine farming.

7 BUILDING RESILIENCE

We will develop a comprehensive approach to addressing the multiple vulnerabilities that small island developing states face from climate change, health pandemics, natural disasters and other global economic shocks. The goal is to create a more resilient people and by extension, a stronger nation.

8 GOOD GOVERNANCE AGENDA

We will craft and enforce Freedom of Information, Term Limits, Integrity in Public Life, Electoral Reform and other good governance legislation.

9 THE REPUBLIC

We will transition to a republican system of government, creating a new national consciousness, where the Head of State will be from St. Kitts & Nevis.

10 IMMIGRATION REFORM

We will pursue comprehensive immigration reforms resulting in Blue Card status, amnesty for all qualified foreigners residing in St. Kitts & Nevis, and a new Residency Status Program.

11 FOREIGN RELATIONS

Globalization continues to redefine politics, business management, technology, and international relations. Therefore, to be better prepared for the global stage, St. Kitts & Nevis must continue to expand its perspectives on international law, multilateralism and building friendships with states beyond OECS, CARICOM, and other regional BLOCS. We will therefore cultivate further meaningful relationships across international borders through diplomacy, strategic business alliances, and global networking.

O LAND OF BEAUTY



FIRST 100 DAYS

- 1** **We will launch** the **\$100 MILLION-DOLLAR DREAM FUND** is designed to power Entrepreneurship and Small Business Development. This fund will inject seed money into approved business ideas of up to EC \$200,000. The \$100 MILLION-DOLLAR DREAM FUND will also provide concessions plus incubation and acceleration business-type, coaching, to yield intergenerational wealth.
- 2** **We will create** 5, 000 New Jobs under our **JOBS NOW** program, over the next five years. This program will reduce unemployment by 50%. We will target manufacturing, farming, infrastructure, and the service industry to generate sustainable employment opportunities.
- 3** **We will introduce** the Housing Revolution that will see the development of **3, 000 HOUSING SOLUTIONS**, distributed fairly across both islands in the next 5 years. With an average of four persons occupying a single household in St. Kitts and Nevis, this housing solution will positively touch 12, 000 residents.
- 4** **We will make** tertiary education more accessible, through an increased number of and access to scholarships to eligible applicants.
- 5** **We will move** towards a **Republic** with a Head of State coming from St. Kitts & Nevis to replace Queen Elizabeth II.
- 6** **We will establish** a **Constituency Development Fund** making money available to address community needs in a timely manner devoid of the normal bureaucracy.
- 7** **We will build** a new Hospital, improve existing facilities, and establish free healthcare through National Health Insurance.
- 8** **We will ensure** the Poverty Alleviation Program (PAP), Skills Training Empowerment Program (STEP), and the Alternative Lifestyle Pathway Program (ALPP), commonly referred to as the “PEACE Program” help those who are most in need.
- 9** **We will allocate** \$50 million to further develop the sports, entertainment, and creative industries.
- 10** **We will retroactively** correct payment oversights due to Government Auxiliary Employees. Additionally, we will develop a pension plan to ensure that all government workers qualify for post-employment financial support. We will also negotiate with private sector employers to create same. Further, minimum wage will be increased to improve the overall standard of living of our people.
- 11** **We will create** a three-year, **duty-free holiday** for public transportation owners to import vehicles powered by clean energy sources. Additionally, we will provide every citizen with the opportunity to import vehicles powered by clean energy sources through a duty-free holiday for eighteen months.



WHERE PEACE ABOUNDS

ECONOMY & JOB CREATION

REDUCING UNEMPLOYMENT

Unemployment, particularly amongst our youth, continues to be a major concern in St. Kitts & Nevis today. Unemployment and poverty are directly related, thus providing job security for those already employed, and generating new employment opportunities for those without work, are One Movement's top priorities.

One Movement Government will therefore:

- Create a new Ministry of Economic Growth and Job Creation focused on tackling unemployment and expanding the economy.
- Create 5000 jobs over the next five years with the goal of reducing unemployment by 50%. **Jobs Now!** will commence within the first 100 days. Projects will include roadworks, the construction of new government houses and a new hospital, along with other infrastructure projects.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

One Movement Government will create new and assist existing small businesses. Key areas will include the digital economy, manufacturing, smart farming and fishing, creative industry, and service industries, among other sectors.

One Movement Government will therefore:

- Create a **\$100 MILLION-DOLLAR DREAM FUND** for entrepreneurship and small business development. This fund will provide seed money for projects or businesses up to EC \$200,000. We will launch this fund within the first 100 days, which will help Kittitians and Nevisians turn their dreams into realities.
- **SMALL BUSINESS SUPPORT CENTRE:** to provide free professional support for entrepreneurs in:
 - Production
 - Marketing
 - Accounting
 - Human Resource Training and Development
 - Inventory Management
 - Networking
 - Other business areas
- Promote small enterprises by making technology, credit, marketing and distribution channels more accessible.



THE HOUSING REVOLUTION

Our people's burning desire is to not only live in our Federation but to also own a piece of their country. One Movement recognizes the role housing plays in developing our country. Building homes for people will also stimulate economic activity in multiple sectors of the economy, particularly in the construction and retail sectors.

One Movement Government will therefore:

- Develop 3,000 housing solutions, distributed fairly across both islands in the next 5 years. We will give low-income earners throughout the country an opportunity to purchase homes.
- Retool the National Housing Corporation (NHC) and remove the partisan influence and nepotism that have corrupted the system.
- Reduce VAT on building materials from 17% to 10% to help first-time homeowners build their homes.
- Provide a Young Homeowners Grant of EC \$3,000 for eligible first-time homeowners, under the age of 35. This will get more young people into affordable climate-resilient housing, to help them build their future.
- Provide immediate support to Clarence Fitzroy Bryant College (CFB) to ensure they have the much-needed resource to expand their current capacity to increase the number of skilled construction workers by at least 40% over the first 12 months.
- We will promote public-private partnerships in housing development and community upgrading. We are already discussing with investors ready, willing and able to provide the required investment.

ECONOMY & JOB CREATION

INVESTMENTS IN INFRASTRUCTURE

Building infrastructural resilience is important for stimulating economic growth and creating new jobs through climate-smart investments in roads, electrical power, schools, hospitals, and water and sanitation systems. Recognizing the impact of climate change on our region, our infrastructure must be built with an eye on the future, utilising modern technological tools and resources to ensure it withstands the uncertain times.

Investments in our infrastructure will ensure greater business efficiency and productivity, increased household incomes and provide avenues to improve our basic needs as we put our economy on a path to sustainable growth and development.

One Movement Government will make a substantial investment in infrastructure through;

- Expanding the road network to reduce transportation costs and generate diverse economic benefits for our farmers among other income-generating professions.
- Building a new and state-of-the-art hospital with modern equipment.
- Retrofitting and upgrade existing health clinics across St. Kitts & Nevis.
- Reducing electricity cost and move towards 100% renewable energy in commercial and domestic spaces.
- Constructing the Basseterre High School once and for all.
- Ensuring there is clean and free-flowing water to the homes of every citizen of St. Kitts & Nevis.

GREEN ENERGY

Climate change has a significant impact on small island developing states like St. Kitts & Nevis. In order to help combat the global warming crisis, we will explore smart and green energy solutions.

- For the first 3 years, we will create a duty-free holiday for public transportation operators to import vehicles powered by clean energy sources.
- For eighteen (18) months, we will provide every citizen with the opportunity to import vehicles powered by clean energy sources through a duty-free holiday.
- We will transition towards clean energy in our government vehicles and street lighting.
- We will provide attractive incentives for the use of green energy by commercial properties, individuals and businesses in our country.

- We will generate electricity using wind farms to provide an efficient alternative to long-distance transmission or development of electricity generation.
- We will facilitate the development of geothermal energy on Nevis which has the potential to help the entire Federation gain greater energy independence, reduce energy costs, and achieve sustainable development.

CITIZENSHIP BY INVESTMENT

In order to ensure the viability, prestige, uniqueness, and growth of our Citizenship by Investment Programme (CBI), we must continue to differentiate ourselves to attract investment. As the oldest CBI program in the Caribbean Region, we must continue to distinguish ourselves as a unique destination worthy of investment.

The CBI program must be designed to benefit all Kittitians and Nevisians, including the elderly and youth, as well as the villages and towns. CBI generates enough funds to positively impact each citizen's life in a real and transformative way—not as a handout, but as a hand-up.

One Movement Government will breathe new life into the CBI by:

- Engaging in a thorough and comprehensive review of the program to correct inadequacies and deficiencies.
- Strengthening the procedures and policies for due diligence, transparency and accountability in the programme in sync with international best practices.
- Ensuring that attracted investments are people-centred, geared at economically empowering our people.
- Increasing our fund allocation to meet educational, health and social care.
- Providing strong advocacy to multilateral institutions to recognize the value of our CIP as an economic tool for Foreign Direct Investment and the empowerment of our people.

One Movement Government will ensure that Nevisians, as equal citizens, benefit equitably from CBI proceeds. This will be accomplished by sharing the revenues between St. Kitts and Nevis on a pro rata population basis, thus guaranteeing fair share for all citizens. With this additional revenue, the CCM-led Nevis Island Administration will bolster the island's health sector; expand local social safety nets; upgrade the Vance W. Amory International Airport; advance the island's sporting arena and programs; provide greater technical and traditional education opportunities, and improve the overall quality of life for Nevisians!

HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES

Our Federation must pay special attention to the elderly, less fortunate, marginalised and vulnerable among us. History must remember us, not only by the environment we create to stimulate economic growth among entrepreneurs but also by how we support our vulnerable. Our war on poverty will provide opportunities for the less fortunate with a plan to grow them out of poverty. It is our conviction that given the modern realities and challenges, the robust social services system instituted by the PAM/CCM-inspired team will provide the required solutions.

One Movement Government will therefore:

- Better manage the Poverty Alleviation Program (PAP), Skills Training Empowerment Program (STEP), and the Alternative Lifestyle Pathway Program (ALPP), commonly referred to as the “PEACE Program” to ensure those who are most in need are able to directly access equitable benefits.
- Review the processes and systems to ensure the execution of the program is more efficient and free from corruption.

CARING FOR OUR PEOPLE

The health of a nation is the wealth of our nation. In our commitment to improving the health and wellness of the people of the Federation, the One Movement Government will ensure there is a holistic approach to healthcare. Our approach will be based upon preventive treatment through healthy lifestyles and rehabilitative healthcare. We will also focus heavily on the mental health and well-being of our young people, directed by technology, patient-centric care, and stakeholder satisfaction.

One Movement Government will therefore:

- Build a new state-of-the-art hospital.
- Invest in high-end medical equipment such as the MRI and Kidney Dialysis units at the JN France Hospital needed to address chronic and serious illnesses, especially
- Re-tool and upgrade the Mary Charles, Alexandra, Pogson, and J.N France hospital with modern equipment, quality renovations, staffing and pharmaceuticals.
- Fast-track the launch of a National Health Insurance.

- Develop a robust national nutrition awareness program as part of an overall strategy to promote wellness and fight non-communicable diseases like obesity, hypertension and diabetes.
- Reduce the cost of medication by joint procurement with other East Caribbean Territories.
- Establish and upgrade Community Health facilities with medical professionals in the field of Geriatric Medicine in order to respond to the needs of our ageing population.
- Focus more on health practitioners by offering training and educational opportunities. Offer scholarships to study in targeted fields such as rheumatology, ophthalmology and oncology, along with other disciplines will be facilitated.
- Work on improving working conditions and ensure that we have a functioning Council of Medical Practitioners.
- Encourage community participation in conceptualising, implementing and monitoring all Community Health Services.

One Movement Government will prioritise the health and well-being of our young people by:

- Ensuring that our educational institutions have mandatory health and eyesight screening for early detection of health issues.
- Introducing a National Health Insurance Plan which will offer free healthcare, dental screening, eye screening and medical prescriptions for children 5-18 years old.
- Developing a mental health policy and implementation plan to deal with increasing incidents of mental health among our young people.
- Introducing a Reach Out Hotline which will provide 24/7 psychological support for young people from a cadre of trained and qualified professionals.
- Expanding access to sexual and reproductive health information and services for young people at our local medical institutions.
- Embarking upon training and support for educators and educational institutions to deal with mental health and well-being.

OUR FUTURE IS BRIGHT



EDUCATION & VOCATIONAL TRAINING

Education and Vocational Training must be accessible and affordable. Such training should prepare our people for the global labour market. .

One Movement Government will focus on technical and vocational skills by:

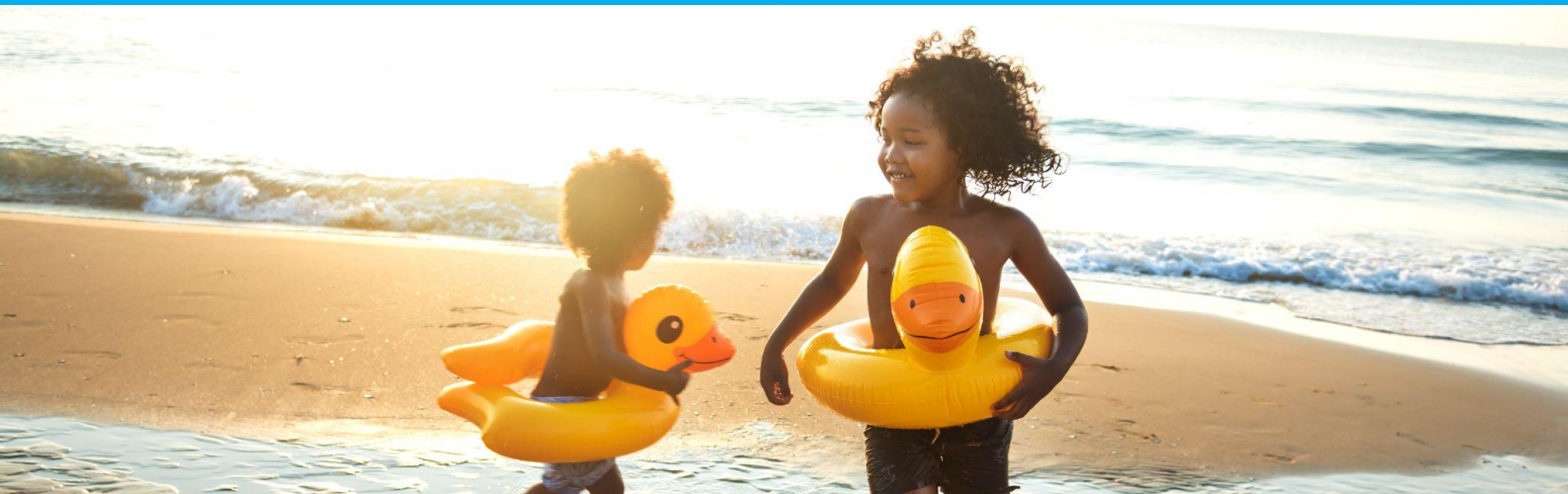
- Implementing a **National Technical and Vocational Educational Training (TVET) Policy** which will provide the regulatory framework to guide and promote in school and future training in high-skilled demand areas.
- Introducing a **National School of Trade and Industry** focused on providing the Caribbean Vocational Qualification (CVQ) to all young people as the attainment of skills that are critical to the development of our society. CVQs are focused on the achievement of key competencies in core work practices of an occupational area consistent with the levels articulated within the region.

One Movement Government will focus on early childhood education by:

- Pursuing equitable access to early childhood education for our children in the Federation
- Facilitating the creation and improvement of our Early Childhood Centres and their pedagogy through the provision of incentives to our entrepreneurs.
- Facilitating the use of ICTs in Early Childhood Education to enhance teaching experience, student satisfaction and administrative purposes.
- Facilitating training for personnel for ongoing professional development in the Early Childhood Centres.
- Creating an early identification system to detect learning impediments in order to take immediate remedial action.

One Movement Government will focus on primary, secondary and tertiary education by:

- Making higher education more accessible and affordable by increasing our scholarship opportunities for young people.
- Reviewing the National Priority List for training and scholarships to ensure that it is in sync with the needs and demands of St. Kitts and Nevis and the global labour market.
- Creating an online platform for the sourcing of available scholarships and training opportunities offered to young people of the Federation.
- Embracing bilingualism and multilingualism in primary schools, through the teaching of at least one foreign language, including French, Spanish or Mandarin.
- Overseeing the expansion of the Economic Cost Awards to include other areas needed for national development.
- Ensuring the history of St. Kitts and Nevis is taught in schools to imbue national consciousness within Kittitians and Nevisians.
- Integrating of ICTs into the curriculum in a more meaningful and intentional way to ensure young people have access to educational opportunities surrounding coding, robotics, entrepreneurship, and digital media, among other areas.
- Increasing allocation to adult lifelong learning programmes to ensure our population continues to be educated and provided with opportunities for their development.
- Facilitating One University Graduate per household dream by making strategic investments in post-secondary education.
- Introducing a government-sponsored national student loan scheme for our young people interested in post-secondary education in sync with our reviewed national priority list for training.
- Improving our Library Services and embark upon a reading campaign across our Federation.



TOURISM

Our Federation continues to benefit from displaying and utilising our uniqueness as a destination to attract record tourist arrivals and provide visitors with an indigenous Kittitian and Nevisian experience. Recognizing the significant GDP contributions from tourism, which are received from local businesses and heritage sites, we must continue to transform the sector into a more globally competitive tourism product.

We must do so through people-centred and environmentally sound tourism which will explore avenues beyond traditional source markets and diversify our offerings to include, community-based tourism, sports tourism, education tourism, health and wellness tourism and business tourism.

One Movement Government will expand our offerings in established, emerging, and new markets by:

- Strengthening our presence in our established source markets of the UK & USA through greater marketing and brand presence in the respective major capitals.
- Building a new 'Tourist Season' by expanding the promotion of the destination in the Southern Hemisphere as we seek to attract a new cadre of visitors from Argentina, Chile, among others in our off-season.
- Embarking upon a program to develop new tourism products for St. Kitts and Nevis
- Increasing our tourism marketing budget by 25% to ensure greater brand presence in our local and source markets.

Land-Based Tourism

- Promoting high-end and stay-over visitors by facilitating and encouraging investment in small to midsize luxury hotels and villas to attract visitors seeking a unique experience and destination.
- Embarking upon a program to develop new tourism products across the Federation.
- Promoting the Airbnb sector as an indispensable part of our tourism product through the provision of incentives.
- Creating a Training Hub for young people to prepare them for employment within the tourism sectors across hotels, restaurants, bars, and historical sites among others in management-level positions.
- Facilitating the creation of deeper linkages with locals to ensure that they receive increased service contracts in the tourism sector.

Community Tourism

- Developing indigenous experiences in our respective communities for visitors to enjoy the uniqueness of St. Kitts as a core component of our tourism product.
- Providing incentives for community residents with ideas and business plans for the transformation of their indigenous tourism offerings in order to provide unique tourism experiences.

Sports Tourism

- Continuing to facilitate the usage of Warner Park as a tourism hub for Regional and international cricket and football as we seek to attract more visitors.
- Providing assistance to SMEs wishing to enter tourism niche markets.
- Bidding for international sporting festivals to attract more visitors to our shores while exploring the beach sports market.

Heritage Tourism

- Identifying and upgrade existing historical, geographical, archaeological and other sites and attractions for offerings as our tourism product.
- Improving the infrastructure and offerings at Craft Markets in St. Kitts & Nevis.

Entertainment Tourism

- Promoting St. Kitts & Nevis as a film destination for the filming of movies, documentaries, commercials, and TV Shows.





CULTURE & CREATIVE INDUSTRIES

Our Culture and Creative Industries – including advertising, arts and crafts, design, fashion, film, video, photography, music, performing arts, publishing, software, computer games, and TV/radio – are the lifeblood of the orange economy. They are also an important source of commercial and cultural value. We will create the infrastructure and programmes, while providing funding and incentives to empower people to monetize their talents and hobbies. The goal is to promote and export their brands and products.

One Movement Administration will, therefore:

- Build a **state-of-the-art Music and Arts Academy** through a Public-Private Partnership structure. In addition to a music and recording studio, the academy will forge linkages and bring in expert practitioners to teach and train. Training will be available in music theory, songwriting, sound engineering, videography, photography, dance etc.
- Establish a special fund for the development of creative arts, culture and entertainment, to assist budding artistes, musicians, songwriters etc. with the development of their craft and special talents from which they can earn a living.
- Introduce a functional creative industries ministry to form part of the Ministry of Youth and Sports and Culture. This department will be responsible for supporting the needs and interests of the aspiring creative artists in our country.
- Creatives are encouraged to access the **Dream Fund** to hire employees and develop their craft, and support the creation of multimedia products for local, regional and international consumption.
- Tap into our existing entertainment and cultural landscape to identify areas for capacity-building and training, and sourcing opportunities for locals to work, showcase their work, and be celebrated by others who visit our shores.
- Provide support to individuals, NGOs and other stakeholders, who are interested in documenting, preserving and marketing our cultural and historical journey as a people.





AGRICULTURE & FOOD SECURITY

Growing what we eat and eating what we grow must be at the centre of our vision to enhance our Food Security. This will mitigate the soaring food prices, inflation, and high food import bill among other challenges. We must therefore strive to be self-sufficient with a specific focus on climate resilience in agriculture as it has the greatest potential for economic growth, healthy lifestyles and prosperity. Through our comprehensive program to not only increase crop production but also through agro-processing, we will seek to address the issue of food security to improve the lives and livelihoods of our farming communities, create employment opportunities for young people and stimulate our rural economy.

One Movement Government will, therefore:

- Use tracts of land, mainly from previous sugar cane plantations, to enhance food production, through smart farming.
- Use modern technology to promote greater yields, including the creation of greenhouses.
- Use technology for matching opportunities with buyers and vendors such as hotels and supermarkets, as well as external markets.
- Provide support and incentives for the development of cottage agro-processing.
- Encourage widespread use of greenhouses, which typically allows farmers to increase their performance and yields while improving the quality of products. We will engage our foreign partners for assistance in that regard.
- Give 100% tax breaks to modern farmers for inputs needed to get the new farms functional.
- Improve the pedagogy for Agricultural Science in our schools starting the primary level to include agro-entrepreneurship and smart agriculture among other important areas.
- Implement the “**Turn-Key Farming Programme**” where individuals already contracted with the government for landscaping-type activities will be provided with land, fencing, seeds, training, equipment and support. The produce they cultivate will be sold to the Marketing Promotion Agency. They will receive a portion of the profits in addition to their regular salary. The remaining profit will go back into the consolidated fund to reinvest in the program.
- Create a Ministry of Agriculture Credit Programme to farmers with non-interest-bearing credit to be used to buy supplies, materials, and small equipment.

CANNABIS AS AN INDUSTRY

St. Kitts and Nevis cannot continue to be behind the emerging Cannabis Industry. The nation must urgently utilise our advantage and rich lands to capitalise on the benefits of the industry.

One Movement Government will build on the decriminalisation of cannabis and ensure there is a framework for the selling of our Cannabis to ensure income diversification. We recognize the urgent need to research the potential of the plant, while being sensitive to the public's concerns.

One Movement Government will take all the necessary measures to realise the potential opportunities of a well-regulated, structured and safe medical and leisure cannabis industry, creating new jobs and new opportunities for local businesses.

One Movement Government will, therefore:

- Create a Medicinal Cannabis Authority focused on developing policies, procedures and guidelines to ensure that medicinal cannabis is available to patients in a safe and efficient manner.
- Support research and development programmes for the country's cannabis industry.
- Support farmers to participate in the cannabis value-added chains.
- Develop new domestic and export markets for St. Kitts and Nevis cannabis industry while supporting the growth and development of the manufacturing and product development of St. Kitts and Nevis.
- Provide reparatory justice to the Rastafarian Community who has been marginalized and incriminated for years based on their religious practices.

AGRICULTURE & FOOD SECURITY

THE BLUE ECONOMY

As a great ocean nation, St. Kitts and Nevis have over 80 times more sea area than land and an Exclusive Economic Zone extending 200 nautical miles beyond its shores. Our national development is directly linked to our ability to sustainably harness this untapped potential of the Blue Economy beyond the confines of fisheries.

One Movement Government will explore, and where feasible, harness other areas of economic potential including offshore energy, underwater geothermal energy,

minerals and other genetic material in addition to the more traditional marine, yachting and tourism services.

One Movement Government will, therefore:

- Seek to triple our fish production within five years, thus enhancing local food security.
- Create an external market, particularly to Europe - that will earn foreign exchange for the country and afford fishermen and their families enhanced living.
- Conduct training for fisherfolk and; provide funding assistance and support.
- Encourage the formation of fisherfolk co-operatives.
- Expand the fish processing capacity to derive greater value and increased employment.
- Build local storage facilities for the extended catch that will be expected.





PEOPLE EMPOWERMENT

Resilience is at the heart of our Kittitian and Nevisian story.

The magnitude of the shocks experienced by our Federation due to the Climate Crisis, COVID-19 Pandemic, and Russian Invasion of Ukraine, among others, has exposed our vulnerabilities as Small Island Developing States (SIDS). Not only has it increased poverty levels, but it has increased our responsibilities as public officials to pay more attention to the growing needs of our vulnerable and marginalised population pockets.

It has also further shown us that resilience is at the heart of our Kittitian and Nevisian story, as we continue to demonstrate a willingness to improve the quality of our lives, regardless of the challenges we face.

One Movement Government recognizes that there must be a transformational approach in our public policy, social safety nets, and expenditure in order to build effective resilience to the physical, social and economic vulnerabilities among our people.

One Movement Government will, therefore:

- Strengthen existing social safety nets and develop new mechanisms to mitigate shocks to protect the most vulnerable.
- Implement appropriate policies and strategies for inclusive and broad-based economic growth.
- Build productive capacities to enable structural economic transformation through diversification and value addition.
- Continuously improving agricultural productivity and expanding rural economic activities within the context of climate change.
- Enhance the role of the private sector with a particular focus on small and medium-sized enterprises.
- Create pre-disaster preparedness and post-disaster recovery scenarios.

People with Disabilities

For too long, we have marginalized to the hindrances affecting our people with disabilities. One Movement believes that all must be included in our developmental aspirations and intends to:

- Upgrade existing educational institutions to accommodate, differently-abled children.
- Provide a physical and social environment that would allow people living with disabilities to participate fully in society.

- Upgrade governmental and other state institutions to accommodate differently-abled people.
- Encourage the employment of differently-abled people in much the same way as other marginalised groups.
- Pass Legislation with a swathe of protection for differently-abled people.
- Work more closely with the St. Kitts Association of People with Disabilities to ensure that they are adequately catered for in our society and equipped with the necessary resources needed for the furtherance of their agenda.

WOMEN

- Ensure access to grant funding for women in entrepreneurship because of their disproportionate representation.
- Provide a conducive environment where sexual and reproductive rights can be appreciated and taught in our schools and other institutions.
- Completely remove VAT on all feminine hygiene products used by women.
- Enact modern Sexual Harassment in Workplace Legislation.
- Encourage a culture where domestic violence is eliminated through stiffer penalties and resocialization through our families and schools.
- Ensure equitable representation of women in our democratic system through statutory boards and other governmental institutions.

ELDERLY

Our society will be defined by how it treats its elderly. It is our shared philosophy that we must always treasure and integrate our retired and elderly in our country as their experiences and skills gained through their long lives are instrumental and instructive to our development.

One Movement Government will, therefore:

- Encourage and support systems of mentorship in our communities from the elderly so our young people can learn from their unique experiences.
- Undertake measures to reduce our structural and attitudinal impediments to retired and elderly citizens' continued participation in nation-building such as:
 - Post-Retirement Educational Tutorship.
 - Post-Retirement Community Engagement through cultural and educational groups

PEOPLE EMPOWERMENT

- Reimagine elderly care facilities by improving access and instituting a home elderly care service where medical practitioners provide at home care.
- Improve accessibility to public spaces including ramps, elevators among other aids.
- Recognize the significant contributions of our elderly across various areas of nation-building through a recognition ceremony annually.
- Launch a Medicine for the Elderly Program to provide payment subsidies for essential drugs for severe chronic illness.
- Create a National Council for Senior Citizens in the Ministry of Social Services Department whereby senior citizens can access support with in-home help through nurse aides and volunteers, who assist with health, personal and domestic needs.
- Retrofitting of community centres and spaces to accommodate Day Care Facilities for the Elderly.
- Encourage volunteerism amongst able-bodied retired constituents to be part of the roving care program and assist with the Meals on Wheels Feeding Programme and assist in daycare facilities.

CONSTITUENCY DEVELOPMENT FUND

The development of our Federation must always be based upon tapping into the skills, aspirations and hopes of all of our people and utilising them as a resource for constituency transformation. Our Constituencies will succeed when we engage in a people-centred development ethos with equitable and fair resource mobilization irrespective your political affiliations. The days of resource distributions in constituencies based on your familiarity and closeness with a political party will be over under our One Movement Government.

We will therefore establish a **Constituency Development Fund** responsible for the fair and equitable distribution of our national resources to build our communities. This will improve the effectiveness of members of parliament as a designated funding mechanism for constituency projects. The Fund will be responsible for:

Physical infrastructure projects which will employ members of the constituency to conduct:

- Conduct minor road repairs, community facilities renovations, community beautification projects, small community projects.

- Respond to emergency cases of garbage pileups, overgrown bushes, potholes and general environmental projection
- Address other community challenges.

Human and Social Development:

- Provide Welfare and Emergency Assistance
- Offer Social Housing Assistance
- Deliver Educational Assistance & Training
- Fund Constituency Sports and Cultural Projects
- Stop Gap Programmes for Poverty Reduction to support national poverty alleviation efforts
- Fund Assistance programs to protect children, elderly, marginalised, disabled and needy residents.

Economic Empowerment:

- Enhance livestock and Crop Production
- Support Micro-Business and Entrepreneurship
- Develop partnerships and networks to further refine supply chains.

Climate Change & Disaster Mitigation

- Funding small projects funding aimed at mitigating and adapting to Climate Change
- Conduct continuous pre-disastrous training.
- Manage natural disasters in a time effective manners.

REPUBLIC: CHARTING OUR DESTINY

Our 39 Years of political independence, after a bitter colonial past, have brought significant benefits to the lives of our peoples. One Movement believes the moment is ripe however to deepen the constitutional and political fabric of our Federation by reviewing our current framework. The time has come for us to fully chart our destiny and actualize our deepest political aspirations.

One Movement Government will, therefore:

- Replace the foreign head of state with a Kittitian or Nevisian Head of State.
- Review the constitution to reflect the identity and ideologies of our Federation.
- Transition to the Caribbean Court of Justice as our final court of appeal.



YOUTH

THE BIG 10 TO EMPOWER YOUTH: OUR YOUTH AGENDA

One Movement has an ambitious and progressive, yet realistic plan to empower our youth. We believe youth should contribute to the development of our Federation, and rally behind the philosophies and programs of our party. It is PAM-CCM that will lead us into a prosperous future. We have summarised our Youth Agenda to the Big 10 to Empower Youth with our full Youth Agenda available.

1. We will launch the **\$100 MILLION-DOLLAR DREAM FUND** aimed at Entrepreneurship and Small Business Development. This fund will be a direct injection of seed money into approved business projects of up to \$200,000 XCD. A component of this fund will also provide training and management support to ensure sustainability and the creation of intergenerational wealth.
2. In order to help young people earn, we will provide a **YOUNG HOMEOWNERS GRANT of \$3,000 XCD** for eligible first-time homeowners, under the age of 35. This will get more young people into affordable climate-resilient housing, to help them build their future.
3. We will ensure that public procurement contracts of a certain value include 40% of young people through apprenticeships, training and employment.
4. We will introduce a **NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN** which will offer free healthcare, dental screening, eye screening and medical prescriptions for children 5-18 years old.
5. We will create an **INNOVATION HUB** which will focus on providing technical and financial support to youth who are interested in mobile app development, computer programming, gaming, robotics and other areas of smart technology to assist them in building careers in technology and innovation.
6. We will establish **ST. KITTS AND NEVIS PERFORMING ARTS & MUSIC ACADEMY**, which will seek to harness and showcase untapped talent in order to develop the theatrical and musical landscape of St. Kitts and Nevis.
7. We will provide **TAX WAIVERS AND CONSTRUCTION GRANTS** for young people who are interested in developing properties into Airbnb in order to continue to reimagine the tourism product and beneficiaries of the product.
8. We will establish a **NATIONAL YOUTH COUNCIL**, which will be responsible for representing youth interests, views and concerns across education, employment, entrepreneurship, agriculture, health and wellness, sport, and creative industries, among other sectors.
9. We will oversee the expansion of our economic cost awards, scholarships and educational opportunities for young people in the Federation to ensure the realisation of their educational goals.
10. We will aggressively tackle youth unemployment over the next five years through the creation of 5000 jobs under our **JOBS NOW** Programme. Jobs will be created across multiple sectors.





SPORTS

One Movement will position sports and athletics as an important aspect of development of our young people of St. Kitts and Nevis. We will revitalise community sporting activities, promote national sporting competitions, and position ourselves to host international sporting events. We will promote Sports as a viable business that can generate individual and national income.

One Movement Government will therefore:

- Establish a National Sports Council to develop national sporting and leisure activities and champion Inter-District, Inter-Secondary, Inter-Island, and Primary Sports meets. This council will also be responsible for talent scouting and creating national sports teams to train and prepare for regional and international events.
- Encourage and support athletes wishing to pursue sports as a profession through the provision of better infrastructure, access to training, scholarships, and scouting.
- Provide greater opportunities and awareness with international schools to visit and scout our athletic talent, in order to give them a vehicle to higher education and increased exposure to sports, as a profession.
- Establish a Masters Sports Programme to encourage accomplished sportspersons to coach and mentor youth.
- Ensure every student is given the opportunity to learn to swim, as a matter of survival and/or sport.
- Build and upgrade existing sporting infrastructure, such as Kim Collins Stadium, Mondo Track, and other facilities to train our athletes to compete globally.
- Fund sporting teams of communities, in areas such as Basketball, Football, Cricket, Tennis, Volleyball and Netball, to ignite a spirit of community competition, which will lead up to National titles.
- Provide greater support to our National Athletes through financial support and technical assistance during training and regional competitions.
- Encourage and support after-school clubs and teams.
- Host US Collegiate sports events and training camps as part of our sports tourism strategy.
- Facilitate training programs and expand opportunities for our young people across sports medicine, sports education, sports psychology, facilities management, coaching, athletes welfare, sports marketing, sports nutrition, and sports tourism among other areas.



MOVING TOWARDS DIGITAL

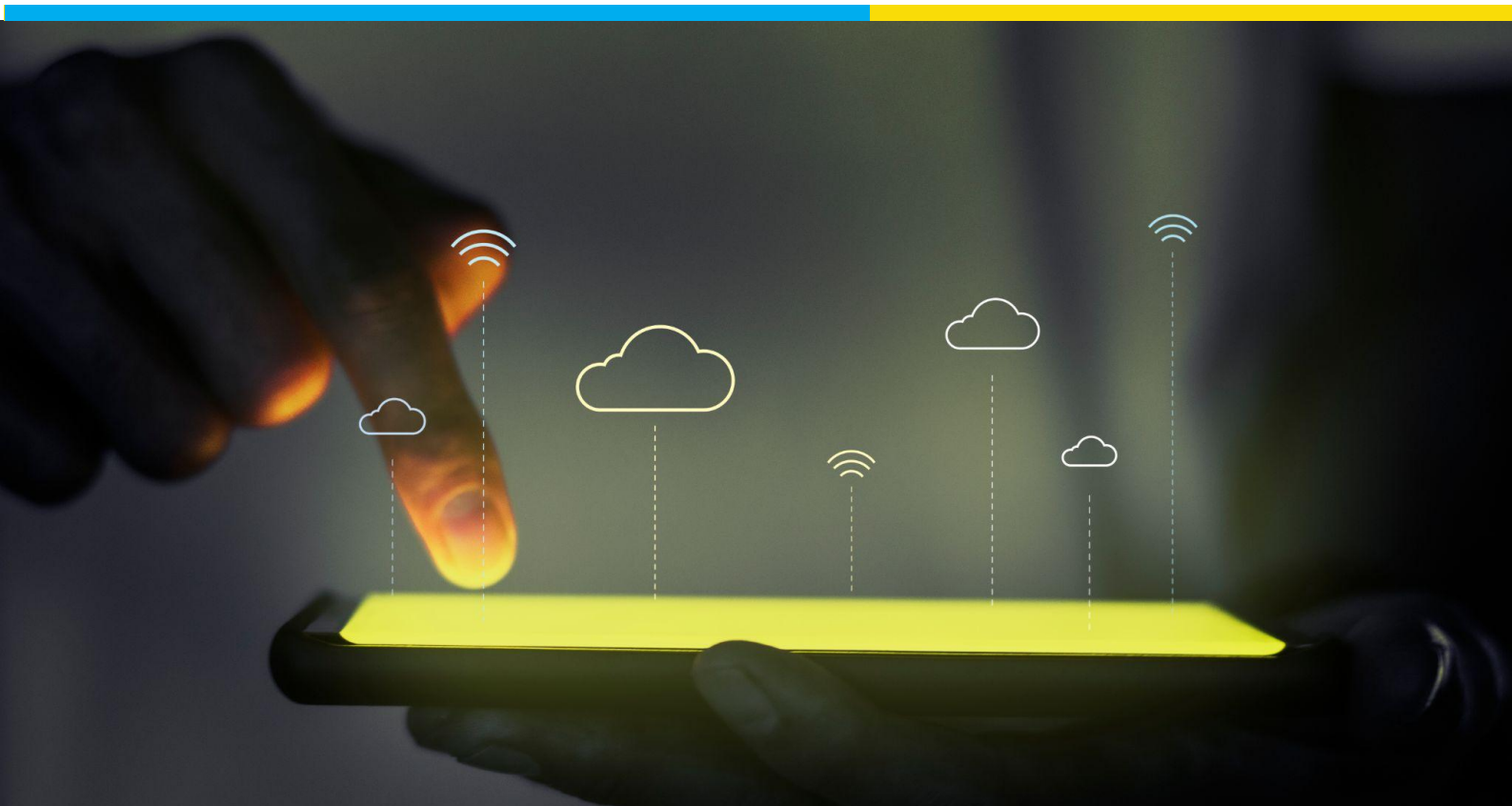


DIGITAL ECONOMY

- Enhancing e-Government offerings.
- Expanding national digital infrastructure and digital platforms throughout the public service.
- Developing digital financial services.
- Accelerating digital entrepreneurship.
- Providing digital skills and literacy with a particular focus on our youth.
- Engaging in regional cooperation to bring economies of scale and scope to technology investments, shared knowledge, and a harmonised regulatory framework to ensure international competitiveness.
- Embarking on an aggressive program to create a digital revolution in St Kitts and Nevis. One that will see our people capitalise on employment and business opportunities globally while staying right here in St. Kitts and Nevis.
- Establishing free broadband Wi-Fi hotspots at all government public spaces across the island.
- Reducing import duties on all computer hardware, software, tablets, and smartphones.
- Outfitting community centres with Internet and IT equipment. The centres will have deployed volunteers working to assist community members in the use of ICT.
- Introduce **“The Innovation Hub”** as a national programme for the development of mobile apps, computer programming, and gaming, targeting young people, to propel them to careers in technology and innovation.

SAFETY & SECURITY

Citizen Security, Crime, and Justice

You, the people of St. Kitts and Nevis, have heard us during our campaign speak consistently about the failed citizen security and crime agenda of the Harris Led Administration. The strategy is misplaced, ill-advised and short-sighted as it prioritises prison sentences and is clouded by nepotism in the building of the Harris Prison. Incarceration has been prioritised over education, medication, and other more important aspects of good governance.

One Movement Government will tackle crime from the root; that is, the social and economic conditions which give rise to crime, in order to take immediate action. We will strengthen our families to ensure that our socialisation is filled with love, empathy, and responsibility as we nurture productive and holistic citizens. We will ensure the rehabilitation and reintegration of young people into society to reduce recidivism. Further, we will provide the police with the latest technology for crime detection and reduction.

One Movement Government will strengthen citizen security by:

- Further equipping the police force with human resources, equipment, psychological support, proper working conditions, and technology needed for their crime-fighting strategies.
- Create Neighbourhood Watch Programs across our Federation and provide training for personnel enrolled in such programs to augment the fight against crime.
- Equip the Newcastle Police and Fire Station with a new fire tender.
- Repair and upgrade all police stations on Nevis.
- Ensure that Nevisian police personnel have adequate transportation.
- Support the army contingent in Nevis.
- Build a Coast Guard unit in Nevis.
- Increase our efforts at mentorship, counselling, conflict resolution and development of emotional intelligence at our schools and other institutions to curb crime from the roots.
- Embark upon **Project CHANGE** at the Prison to reintegrate youth offenders. This programme will include life-skills training, small business development, music training, counselling, psychological services and educational enrichment. **Project CHANGE** will be geared at ensuring a smooth transition from the local Prison into society to become productive and active citizens.
- In coordination with the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court, establish a **SECOND CHANCE** programme which will expunge the criminal records of juveniles for minor offences, then reintegrating them into society as productive citizens.
- Work towards establishing a **new rehabilitation institution for at-risk Youth and Juveniles** to provide an alternative to incarceration. We will aggressively address youth deviance in schools by reshaping our community spirit and reforming our discipline codes and engagement with students.

One Movement Government will support our Justice System by:

- Ensuring the maintenance of an Independent Judiciary.
- Strengthening the Judiciary by ensuring the timely delivery of resources.

GOVERNANCE

One Movement believes that a key step in promoting economic empowerment and good governance in our Federation is through the elimination of corruption by public officials. The time has come for family and friends to not benefit directly from our government because of their familial connections to the political establishment. A Ond Movement Government will aggressively promote good governance by:

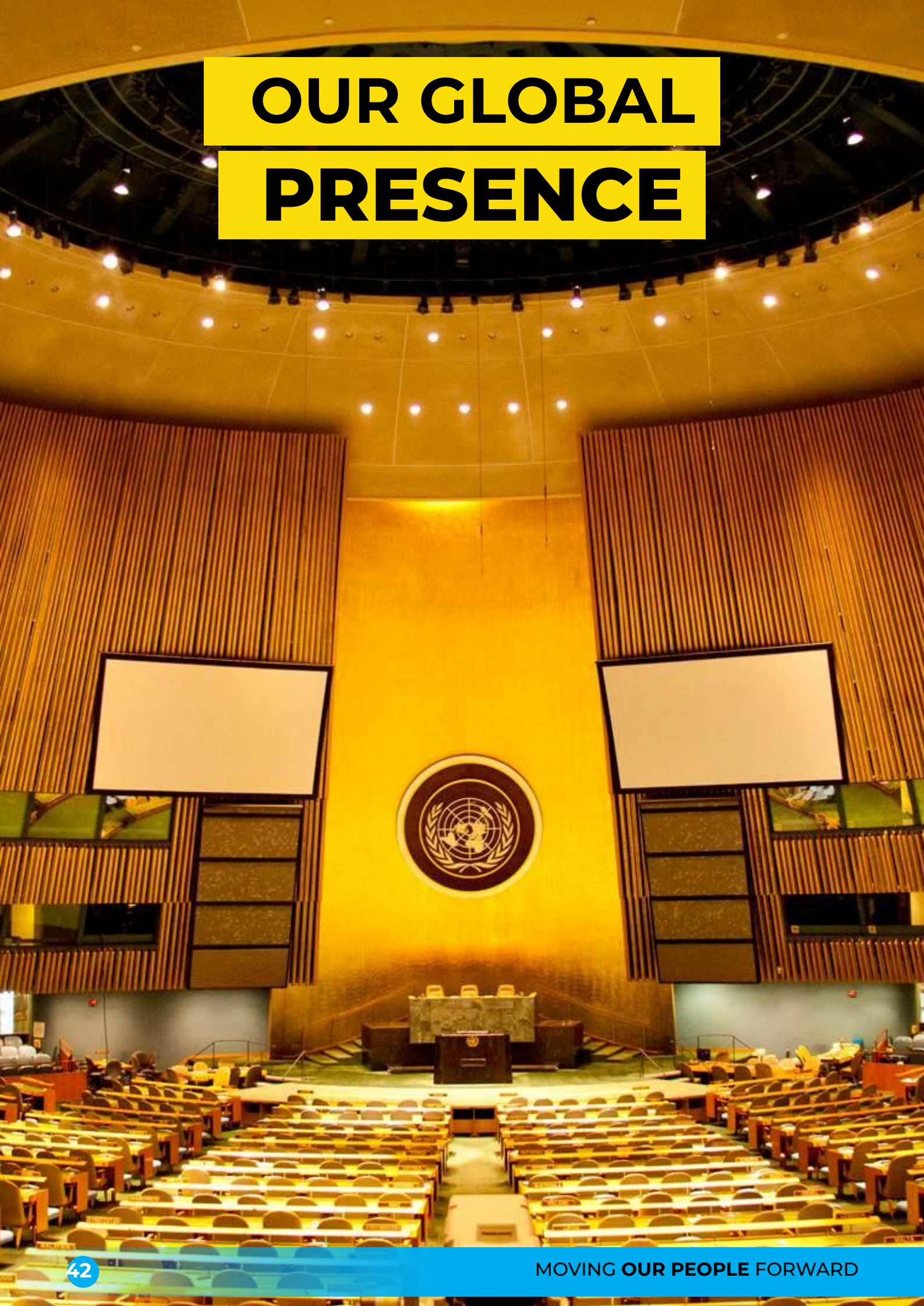
- Passing Anti-Corruption, Freedom of Information & Integrity in Public Life Legislation.

IMMIGRATION REFORM AND DIASPORA ENGAGEMENT

Global Citizens with Kittitian And Nevisian Heritage

The story of the Kittitian man or Nevisian woman who will chase their dreams in the world because of their inherent talent and skill is a well-known story. The stories of global citizens also finding homes in our country because of our natural scenery, economic opportunities and the warmth of our people is a common story. In chasing these dreams, we must embrace these people as they continue to help us develop our country.

One Movement Government will create a new deal in Immigration Reform resulting in Blue Card Status by:

- Create a new residency status program.
- Reducing the number of years needed for legal residents to qualify for citizenship.
- Establishing an amnesty for all qualified foreigners who are residents in our country.
- Creating a diaspora program where highly skilled and successful Kittitians and Nevisians would come back home to share their knowledge, technical and financial resources, plus their experiences with our young people in order to motivate them.

Regional Integration and Internationalism

One Movement believes that our position in the world must cause St. Kitts and Nevis to be known for appreciating the Principles of International Law, multilateralism and building friendships with states which will advance our cause. Our Foreign Relations will be based on mutual respect and principle. It is our shared view that we are stronger together and while we build international friends we will continue to advance regional integration through OECS & CARICOM, and other BLOCS to ensure prosperity for all of our peoples.

One Movement Administration will therefore:

- Continue to support the regional integration efforts through OECS & CARICOM, and other political and economic BLOCS to provide strong support for the urgent resolution of regional travel, free movement of our people, telecommunications, reparations, food security as well as providing additional support and improved cooperation for marginalized member states such as Haiti.
- Embark upon a sensitization, training, and awareness campaign across St. Kitts & Nevis on the benefits and opportunities of regional integration.
- Provide additional educational opportunities and training for our Diplomats and aspiring Diplomats to ensure that they are well equipped to forge strategic friendships for our Federation.

Foreign Affairs

- Lend our voices on issues such as Climate Change, Blacklisting, Correspondent Banking, the Russian Invasion of Ukraine, CBI, and Concessional Financing among others.
- Adhere to the principles of multilateralism and principles of non-intervention and non-interference in the domestic political matters of other independent countries.
- Establish Economic Diplomacy with Non-Traditional countries in order to expand our economic opportunities for foreign direct investment and strategic bilateral partnerships.

VOTING MADE EASY GUIDE

- Our polling stations open at 6:00 AM and close at 6:00 PM. If you are on the line at 6:00 PM, and you have not cast your ballot, be patient as you must be allowed to vote. If you are at the polling station and it is after 6:00 PM, it is your right to be allowed to vote. You can also tag along with other friends to keep you engaged while in the line waiting for your turn to decide your future.
- Check with your nearest polling station or the online accessible voters' list to see where you are going to cast your ballot and ensure that you walk with your Voters' Identification Card.
- Do not worry if you have lost your Voter's Identification Card. You are still be allowed to vote. Simply, present an alternative form of government-issued identification like your Social Security Card, Passport or Driver's Licence.
- When you get to the polling station, the Presiding Officer will confirm your identity before you are allowed to vote to ensure that you are registered. The agents of the political parties will tick your name off the list to ensure no one else attempts to vote for you.
- You will not be allowed to take your phone and smart watch into the voting booth.
- The wearing of political party colours is not allowed in the polling stations. There will be white lines drawn outside the polling station within 100 yards, where you cannot gather in big crowds and canvas.
- When you have been given your ballot paper and a pencil, you can now access the voting booth and mark your **X** in the space next to the name of the People's Action Movement or Concerned Citizens Movement candidate in your constituency.
- The Presiding Officer will examine your ballot paper, without unfolding it, to ascertain relevant information and will then remove the counterfoil and deposit your ballot in the box.
- You have now cast your ballot to safeguard your future.
- You have voted for the PAM-CCM partnership that is the best hope for the future of St. Kitts & Nevis.
