



Honouring the life of The Late Ambassador Plenipotentiary, His Excellency Vance Winkworth Amory (1946-2022)

Growing and Diversifying the Economy

Tax Relief

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Maintain the Unincorporated Business Tax (UBT) Rate at 2% to make it easier for small businesses to thrive and to encourage the development of new entrepreneurs:
- 2. Maintain the Corporate Tax rate at 25% for companies who have retained at least 75% of their prepandemic staff levels: and
- 3. Reduce VAT from 17% to 10% before eliminating it, thereby keeping prices low for all.

Tourism & the Allied Services

- Attract Foreign Direct Investment or Joint Venture in the establishment of an All-Inclusive, branded hotel and 2 additional "Five Star" International Hotel Brands:
- Redesign & expand Tourism Marketing Programmes to attract stayover tourists from Europe, particularly key EU member States and Scandinavia;
- Transition the CFBC Hospitality Division into a Comprehensive Hotel Training Academy to better prepare our people for jobs in the hotel and tourism sector, including frontline customer service, back office operations, management, room service, and food and beverage:
- Refurbish and renovate the Eco Park at Cranstoun Estate as well as develop new product offerings for the Park;
- Negotiate with existing airlines and potential new carriers to the Federation in order to improve airlift and obtain cheaper airfares from our major source markets like the USA and UK; and
- Expand and rehabilitate RLB International Airport to increase our tourism potential.

Manufacturing & Trade

Your PLP Government will:

- Complete, launch and implement the Revised National Manufacturing Strategy which will help local entrepreneurs develop and market their goods and products;
- 2. Boost export of local goods by establishing an Export Processing Zone and providing export readiness support including leveraging existing trade agreements, and streamlining port access, warehousing and shipment preparation;
- 3. Attract new, high-end electronic assembly plants to the Federation;
- 4. Broaden service offerings by the Small Business Development Centre (SBDC) within the Ministry of Trade & Industry to better support small businesses; and
- 5. Complete the Renovation, Expansion & Capacity-building programme at the Bureau of Standards and Multi-purpose Laboratory in order to widen its services, including product and air quality testing, design, registration and monitoring in line with international standards.

Agriculture & the Blue Economy

- 1. Improve land use policies to maximise crop yields from the same plots;
- 2. Develop an Agro-Biz programme to create more farming entrepreneurs;
- 3. Incorporate innovation and ICTs in agriculture and fisheries development to ease the burden on agricultural businesses, including field automation, renewable energy supply, and digital market platforms and tools;
- 4. Invest in and expand soil-free aquaponics for small crops like lettuce, peppers and broccoli;
- 5. Support the development of backyard and container gardening, to reduce reliance on imports, provide healthy foods that families consume, and reduce weekly grocery bills;
- 6. Develop deep sea fishing practices and expand the fish spawning/hatchery sector by investing in equipment, facilities and training;
- Develop new fisheries facilities in Dieppe Bay, Sandy Point and Palmetto Point to enable fishing communities to expand their trade.

Information and Communications Technologies (ICTs) & Innovation

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Complete the Deloitte Project regarding Digitisation of the Economy, which will facilitate more and better online service delivery across the entire public sector;
- 2. Undertake a Legislative Review E-commerce/ digital-based commercial activity to better facilitate and promote the growth of e-commerce;
- 3. Collaborate with the Eastern Caribbean Currency Union towards the advancement of a safe, regulatory environment for crypto currency, including D-cash, Bitcoin, etc.; and
- 4. Support The Cable with the establishment of an internationally competitive Tier 3/4 Data Centre that offers key data storage, backup and recovery, management and networking solutions to regional governments, and private sector entities.

Micro, Small & Medium-sized Enterprises (MSMEs)

- 1. Update Legislation for MSMEs, based on the new CARICOM Model Bill to facilitate freedom of movement of MSMEs across the region;
- 2. Establish Business Incubators in urban and rural areas so that small business start-ups can access the right support with low overheads;
- 3. Develop business parks and centres within the urban and rural areas, through public-private sector partnerships, to stimulate greater economic activity and free enterprise throughout St. Kitts and Nevis:
- 4. Provide a Special Fiscal Incentive Package for existing businesses that choose to open branches in rural areas, in order to stimulate economic activity and the creation of new jobs outside of Basseterre; and
- 5. Widen Small Business Development Centre's (SBDC's) support to the private sector in the areas of supply chain sector interruptions, inventory management and procurement systems and dealing with international transshipment challenges.

Economic Diversification

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Undertake aggressive investment promotion to attract light manufacturing in sectors such as electronics, including semi-conductors; food and beverage; home furnishings and interior décor;
- 2. Heighten international marketing efforts to target the international Research and Development (R&D) sector investments in St. Kitts and Nevis;
- 3. Create an enabling environment for joint venture partnerships between foreign companies and local, indigenous businesses, while ensuring that our indigenous business partners' interests are protected; and
- 4. Intensify its focus on the development of the Services Sector, with international marketing and promotional efforts to drive service-driven, foreign investment to our shores.

- 1. Successfully build out the medicinal cannabis industry in St. Kitts and Nevis, to realise economic and health benefits;

Entrepreneurship

- Continue to expand and support the development of the entertainment and creative industries, through the good work of the Ministry of Entertainment.


Access to Land

- Implement a New Smart Land Management Programme throughout the Federation. Infrastructure, land usage and allocation plans would be used for efficient and sustainable development in agriculture, construction, and housing services.

Skills and Professional Development

Improving our Peoples Quality of Life

Poverty Alleviation Programme

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Increase the PAP from \$500 a month to \$1000 a month, from 1st September 2022;
- 2. Expand the number of families that would benefit from the PAP programme.

A Liveable Income

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Establish a liveable income of \$3000 monthly. Any person making less than this amount will qualify to gain assistance from the government through one of its social safety net programmes, so that each month no worker should have less than \$3000 in his/her pocket;
- 2. Ensure that all police officers, nurses teachers, defence force personnel receive a minimum salary of \$3000 per month; and
- 3. Consider the possibility of raising the minimum wage.

Support for Young Mothers

- 1. Create an on the job work experience programme to develop new skill sets;
- 2. Introduce a Child Care Allowance of \$500 for parents making less than \$3000 per month; and
- 3. Institute a free after-hours Child Care Programme to allow women to further their academic development, skill sets and to increase their income.

- 1. Create a university education account of \$5000 in each child's name at National Bank, which will mature when they attain the age of 18, making university a reality for many more young people;
- 2. Bolster our Nation's Maternal, Child Health and Family Health programmes at our primary health care facilities and within the primary and secondary school settings;
- Finalise the United Nations (UN) ratification process regarding the Optional Protocols for the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC), in order to prevent trafficking in children and involvement of children in armed conflict, among other related matters; and
- 4. Renovate and expand residential care and court-appointed services offered by New Horizons Rehabilitation Center to children in crisis.

Housing

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Construct 2,000 new housing solutions for lower and middle income families around the island of St. Kitts, particularly in marginalised and growing communities;
- 2. Provide duty free concessions to assist college/university graduates to build, purchase or renovate their first home. This will help them in making the transition faster from being a property owner, while enabling them to move quicker into raising families and building their net worth; and
- 3. Extend the reduction in the annual land and house taxes for first-time homeowners.

Wages and Severance

- 1. Ensure that all statutory bodies instituted by government receive wage increases; and
- 2. Ensure that employees who are entitled to severance payments, will access such in a reasonable time frame.

- Sustain our response to the COVID-19 pandemic, to effectively respond to other emerging health emergencies (monkeypox) and maintain response to endemic communicable diseases:
- Reduce the impact of Non-Communicable Diseases (CNCDS) which is our biggest health challenge:
- Establish a Cardiac Catheterization Unit to perform diagnostic and treatment catheterization services, so as to reduce morbidity and mortality due to cardiac disorders:
- Establish a National Cancer Registry to augment the prevention and control of the leading cancers such as: breast, colon, cervical cancers, prostate cancer;
- Establish a Colposcopy Unit at JNF General Hospital to appropriately manage patients with cervical cancer:
- Implement a comprehensive palliative care and pain management programme and services for the terminally ill:
- Implement Substance Abuse prevention & treatment programmes and services with emphasis on substances including alcohol and cannabis:
- Implement health information systems to improve efficiency of services accessed at the Federal Office of the Ministry of Health and improve efficiency of services at all 17 health centers and four (4) hospitals in the Federation:
- Offer Basic Mammography services at JNF General Hospital to eliminate barriers to breast cancer screening;
- 10. Provide Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) services onsite at JNF General Hospital; and
- Enhance Primary Health Care services and treatments to diabetics, in an effort to reduce the number of amputations, so as to ensure that patients maintain a high quality of life, preservation

National Health Insurance

- 1. Establish the initial phase of the National Health Insurance system that will initially focus on the vulnerable, the very young, and the very old;
- 2. Provide all medical practitioners with ongoing professional training so that they provide passionate empathetic care;
- 3. Keep children's healthcare free up to the age of 16; and
- 4. Conduct an overall analysis of the health system, looking for areas for enhancement in infrastructure and human resources.

Keeping our Streets and Borders Safe

Safer Streets

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Remain committed to the PEACE Programme to ensure that it creates jobs and that individuals on the programme be provided with positive outlets and employment options;
- 2. Prioritise Community Policing to ensure that the police can build trust with the residents whom they serve; and
- 3. Develop a sex-offender registry to help with the protection of our youth and vulnerable from sexual predators.

Immigration and Border Management

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Fast track and streamline citizenship applications for descendants of our diaspora citizens, particularly those in the USA, other CARIFORUM Countries, and the United Kingdom (UK);
- 2. Reduce the number of years for acquiring citizenship from 14 years to 7 years, thereby embracing and supporting our CARICOM, CARIFORUM and Diaspora Citizens;
- 3. Change the work permit policy, empowering employees with the ability to control and secure their own future. Any person who legitimately resides in the Federation should be able to have access to a work permit for the approved duration of their stay up to twelve (12) months; and
- 4. Carry out an amnesty programme to regularise the status of immigrant residents in St. Kitts and Nevis.

Emergency and Disaster Management

- 1. Establish Decentralised Warehousing for Disaster Mitigation and Management, at Sandy Point and Tabernacle to provide rapid assistance to people when there is an emergency;
- Commission and expand the Emergency Command Centre at NEMA, with full integration with private and public sector telecommunications providers and the National Telecommunications Regulatory Commission (NTRC);
- 3. Provide legislative and/or regulatory support to strengthen the operational mandate of NEMA; and
- 4. Create a Climate Resilience Fund to bolster the Nation's preparedness, emergency response to emegencies and disasters, and to strengthen the assistance provided by NEMA to affected communities.

Education

- 1. Transform educational curriculum and delivery modes to meet our society's modern demands. This in turn, will assist in equipping our professionals to meet the technological needs of traditional and new emerging trades;
- 2. Focus on academical and vocational skills to ensure that all children excel no matter where their strength lies. We will ensure each child develops his/her full potential, be it in entertainment, sports or vocational work;
- 3. Provide every student with a 21st century education that will cultivate the skills, mindsets, and literacies needed to become lifelong learners and contributors in our ever-changing world;
- 4. Transition the CFBC Hospitality Division into a Comprehensive Hotel Training Academy to better prepare our people for jobs in the hotel and tourism sector, including frontline customer service, back office operations, management, room service, and food and beverage;
- 5. Heighten promotion of modern languages, numeracy and language skills in schools at all levels, in order to ensure that more of our young people leave school ready for work, either in the public or private sector, or as entrepreneurs;
- 6. Ensure that our people will be better able to take advantage of employment and business opportunities in the rest of the Caribbean Basin and beyond, where English is not the dominant language;
- 7. Improve budgetary support for additional devices to be made available to our primary, secondary and tertiary level students, in order to improve their access to online educational resources for research; and further facilitate online education, completion of homework, SBAs, term papers, etc:
- 8. Undertake an extensive audit of the home networking requirements for students, in partnership with local telecommunications providers, such as The Cable in order to ensure that connectivity is maximized and online educational access is further facilitated;
- 9. Provide economic support to a wider range of university students.

Sports Development

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Allocate \$10 million to jump start the professionalisation of cricket, football, netball and track and field:
- 2. Develop a domestic 20/20 tournament where five or six teams engage to create a ready market for our sports professionals;
- 3. Develop female cricket leagues, up to the level of 20/20 and test cricket qualifiers; and
- 4. Develop an aquatic centre to provide opportunities for our young people to learn to swim, compete, and to essentially become an Olympian.

Arts, Culture & Heritage

- 1. Create new educational and tourism offerings by showcasing our heritage, including our Country's history of slavery and sugar production; and
- 2. Establish a state of the art National Centre for the Performing Arts, to enhance our nation's creative industry and to preserve our traditional folklore such as masquerade and quadrille dancing, calypso, and other local art forms.

Social & Community Services

- 1. Replicate the Saddlers' Home Model in Sandy Point and along the eastern domain of the island, in order to enhance professional care delivery for our senior citizens:
- 2. Construct Day Care Centres for the elderly in East, Central and West Basseterre, as well as Cayon and Sandy Point;
- 3. Complete centralization of all Government social safety net programming under the Ministry of Social Services, particularly via the Single Household Registry and the national database, to facilitate case management and data-informed policy development for beneficiaries;
- 4. Establish a 24-hour Safe Space for vulnerable young women and children who are experiencing challenging situations, as a transitionary home;
- 5. Develop a National Centre of Excellence for Ageing and Gender Studies, to appropriately respond to the needs of our senior citizens, including social inclusion and connectedness; and address gender specific challenges to the full participation of men and women in national development;
- 6. Further build-out of programming regarding the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, including improvement of access to public buildings and community-based institutions via aids such as ramps, elevators and braille signage; broad-based duty-free concessions on the importation of special purpose vehicles, etc;
- 7. Develop a Partnership with the National Telecommunications Regulatory Commission (NTRC) for St. Kitts and Nevis' inclusion in the Caribbean Video Assistance Service (CVAS) for the Blind and Deaf via video-enabled smartphones and computers which assist these differently abled persons with accessing and exiting buildings and public spaces on their own:
- 8. Construct a brand New Women's Training and Development Centre, that includes an emergency shelter for victims of domestic violence and their families, with full police presence;
- 9. Construct Senior Citizens Day Care Centres in Communities with ageing populations such as East Basseterre, St. Peter's, St. Paul, Sandy Point and Old Road/Verchilds/ Middle Island; and
- 10. Construct new Community Centres in Half Way Tree and Saddlers/Parsons Villages.

Infrastructure Build-out & Rehabilitation

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Expand and rehabilitate R L B International Airport which has far outgrown its size, aircraft, and passenger and airline services capacity;
- 2. Develop a new marina to the East of Port Zante to transform and revitalise East Basseterre, and to offer additional marina capacity in downtown Basseterre;
- 3. Improve our secondary roads throughout St. Kitts and undertake feasibility studies to determine how best to reduce congestion in the built-up areas, also to improve road safety while creating access to the interior of the island by constructing bypass roads;
- 4. Rehabilitate through public/private collaboration, the SSMC Railway lines which continue to be neglected and remain a vital national asset. We will transform this railroad system into an efficient transportation mode for moving goods and services throughout the island of St. Kitts; and
- 5. Ensure that roads in all housing projects are completely paved and/or repaved.

Urban & Rural Revitalisation & Renewal

- 1. Develop public, and green spaces throughout the country in order to improve family, recreation and community life;
- 2. Build out public transportation connectivity in areas without public transport systems, including Bird Rock and Frigate Bay;
- Implement the National Urban Resilience Plan within the Federation that incorporates the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Disaster Risk Reduction goals set out in the Sendai Framework, and responds to the population and household growth in urban areas over the past 22 years;
- 4. Launch and implement the New National Physical Development Plan; and
- 5. Introduce a sustainable plan for clearance of abandoned building in urban and rural areas, and also repurpose, where possible, vacant lots for productive uses.



PEACE Programme

Seven years ago, St. Kitts and Nevis was the murder capital of the world. Mothers would not know if their children would come home at night. People hid in their homes, businesses did not invest in certain areas and our people lived in a constant state of fear.


It wasn't until the election of Prime Minister Timothy Harris that we had a leader who was prepared to fix this problem that had been ignored for too long.

Working with the police, local youth groups and community leaders, as well as policy experts in the relevant fields, Prime Minister Harris built a diverse coalition of people from across the board to find real solutions to the troubles faced.

Due to the hard work and persistent leadership of Prime Minister Timothy Harris, a unique programme was delivered, known as the Peace Programme, that began healing the heartbreak of the past and resulted in our streets, our homes, and our communities being safe.

There are two very important instruments that will be reviewed by the Peoples Labour Party namely the current Energy Policy and the Energy Supply Act. The former will be used to provide guidance in the development of renewable energy projects and energy conservation efforts, while the latter will offer legal and institutional bases for creating sustainable energy programmes and services.

With a large geothermal resource and moderate-to-high wind and solar resources, St. Kitts and Nevis has sufficient renewable energy resource potential to meet some or all of its current and future electricity needs.

The key provisions of the National Energy Policy (NEP) require that all suppliers procure a license before generating electricity, that cannot exceed 25 years, which should accommodate nearly all renewable energy technologies even though some can have a longer usable lifetime.

Although electricity rates per kilowatt-hour (kWh) for St. Kitts and Nevis are lower than the regional average, we are heavily reliant on fossil fuels for electricity generation, leaving us vulnerable to global oil price fluctuations which directly impact the cost of electricity. The fuel charge for residential customers is currently subsidized.

Opportunities for Clean Energy Transformation: St. Kitts and Nevis have considerable renewable energy resources. WE ARE BLESSED WITH WIND, SUNSHINE AND TWO VOLCANOES.

The 35.6 MW solar energy plant and 44.2 MWh battery storage facility will be built on government provided land in the Basseterre Valley, adjacent to the City of Basseterre and the current SKELEC PowerStation. It will provide the residents of our twin-island Federation with a reliable and renewable clean energy source at an approximate cost savings of 20-25% compared to the current diesel-generated power system. The system will provide between 25-30% of the nation's current power generation needs, while displacing the same amount of diesel-generated capacity.

The solar storage project will help solidify the financial strength of SKELEC over the next 20+ years, while substantially reducing the islands' fuel cost over that period. The expected fuel avoidance cost from installing the solar farm will not only benefit the Federation's energy demand but also represent the most viable option for securing SKELEC's financial future.

The Peoples Labour Party will therefore put the Federation on a trajectory to becoming "the smallest green energy twin-island nation in the western hemisphere" where the principle goal is "to become a twin-island nation with a sustainable energy sector where reliable, renewable, clean, and affordable energy services are provided to all its citizens."

Energy & Waste

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Review the current Energy Policy and Amendments to the Energy Supply Act to facilitate more renewable energy programmes, projects and services and to strengthen our conservation efforts;
- 2. Continue to build out the LeClanche solar energy project which entails the 35.6 MW solar energy plant and 44.2 MWh battery storage facility in the Basseterre Valley, to increase our reliable, renewable energy sources, thereby decreating the cost of energy in the Federation;
- 3. Put the Federation on a trajectory to becoming the smallest green twin-island nation in the western hemisphere;
- 4. Encourage the use of car-pooling to cut down on fuel consumption, especially in the face of ever rising global fuel prices over which Government has no control;
- 5. Promote the use of public transport, particularly when engaging in non-essential travel;
- 6. Promote the switch to energy efficient lighting for residential and commercial properties; and
- 7. Build out the Solid Waste Management and Recycling Project between our Government and the Government of the Republic of China (Taiwan). The facility will sort, bale and pack recyclables, then ship out for processing.

Water Resources

- 1. Collaborate with the private sector to prioritise desalination to address water shortages, with a view to establishing at least one desalination plant on St. Kitts;
- 2. Amend the building codes to include residential and commercial water harvesting with the option of the construction of cisterns or the use of water reclamation for all new buildings. The Government will also adopt a national water conservation policy which reflects this amendment; and
- 3. Drill and commission new wells in Shadwell and Cayon to meet the potable water needs of residents in Basseterre, Cayon, Keys, and other surrounding communities.

Marine Protection

Your PLP Government will:

- Undertake an aggressive search for and implementation of solutions to stem proliferation of Sargassum seaweed that choke marine life, etc;
- 2. Enforce policies to prevent nearshore over-fishing and encourage deep sea fishing in areas that do not compromise fish hatching zones;
- 3. Engage in strong advocacy for anti-dumping practices, particularly of plastics which are not biodegradable and harm marine life;
- 4. Enact and implement legislation re: the ban on single use plastic bags;
- 5. Develop and enforce new regulations for the St. Kitts and Nevis Marine Management Area (SKNMMA);
- Create an enabling environment for marine research and development programmes with reputable international businesses and educational institutions; and
- 7. Commission research and development into sargassum seaweed, to minimise the negative impact on our beaches and coastal life.

Climate Action & Resilience

- Construct retaining walls at Fortlands, Irishtown Bay Road, New Guinea, Frigate Bay and Black Rocks;
- 2. Develop an Adaptation Strategy for the agricultural sector and the coastal and marine environments; and
- 3. Reinforce buffer zones along riverbanks, coastlines and wetlands using vegetation and engineering solutions.

Smart Land Management & Building Codes

- 1. Implement a New Smart Land Management Programme throughout the Federation. Infrastructure, land usage and allocation plans would be used for efficient and sustainable development in agriculture, construction, housing, and manufacturing services.
- 2. Update building code legislation that incorporates stronger construction grade materials, hurricane-proof exterior walls, water catchment and cisterns, etc;
- 3. Enforce existing legislation and policies that prohibit construction in close proximity to ghaut sides and river banks;
- 4. Continue to improve the building code throughout the Federation, in order to incorporate green technologies, renewable energy, water harvesting for climate resilience and reduced energy costs; and
- 5. Enhance home construction to ensure that new houses are better able to withstand Category 4 and 5 hurricanes.

Strengthening our Governance

Public Sector Reform

- 1. Review and revamp the appointment system of the public service sector to ensure that every worker receives the fairness and job security they deserve. All public sector employees should become eligible for appointment after 3 years of uninterrupted acceptable service based on performance evaluation;
- 2. Review the Government's duty free allowances for civil servants;
- 3. Ensure that traveling officers at salary level K33 and above will be granted duty free on vehicles up to \$100,000, but should have 5 years of service to the Country;
- 4. Allow duty free concessions for all traveling posts at K33 and above once every 10 years;
- 5. Create a duty-free allowance for positions K38 and above for persons in the service more than 3 years with renewal every 7 years;
- 6. Introduce a Productivity and Performance-based Remuneration System with respect to pay raises which is modern and competitive in a highly production workplace;
- 7. Establish a compulsory requirement for annual performance appraisals using a two-pronged approach comprising of supervisory evaluation and self-evaluation; and
- 8. Begin the process of acceding to the Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ) as our country's final appellate court thereby replacing the Privy Council. This will move us closer to fulfilling our aspirations as an independent, developed nation.

Strengthening our Governance

Electoral Reform

Your PLP Government will:

- 1. Pass legislation for Fixed Date General Elections;
- 2. Complete the full digitization of all Voter Registration Databases;
- 3. Initiate a Voter Re-registration Exercise with Proof of Residency, etc. to ensure that electors vote in the constituency where they live;
- 4. Recalibrate and re-define all electoral districts in St. Kitts and Nevis based on the most recent Population Census in order to ensure that the constitutional and legislative provisions are being followed, such as the near equal populations that each constituency should have;
- 5. Call a national referendum on the status of overseas voters and determine as to whether their right to vote should be based on the establishment of an At-Large constituency that represents Diaspora Affairs; and
- 6. Update and implement regulations to give effect to the Integrity in Public Life Act of 2013.

Improving Federal Relations

- 1. Carry out a feasibility study on the construction of a bridge between St. Kitts and Nevis; and
- 2. Institutionalise constitutional provisions for revenue and expenditure sharing as per Section 110 of the Constitution and the expected advice and recommendations of the World Bank Consultancy that was requested by the Federal Government.



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
